As a parent in the GUHSD Online Learning Academy/Glendale Union Online, you have the right to a quality education for your student.. We have established policies and procedures regarding students in online classes. Our student handbook can be found online at http://online.guhsdaz.org/ but some of the key policies are outlined here:

- Plagiarism: Any student found plagiarizing work for a course or assisting another student in
 plagiarizing will be subject to failing grades for the plagiarized assignments and may be dropped
 from the course and/or program.
- Final Exams: Students must have an overall course grade of 60% or better to be eligible to take the final exam. Students must pass final exams with a 60% or better to receive credit for the course regardless of the overall course grade. Only students who fail the final exam will be given one retake. Students who fail the final exam twice will receive an F in the class regardless of the overall course grade. Once the final exam is taken, no other coursework will be accepted.
- Course Completion: Students are expected to complete a minimum of 3 classes per 9-week period. Failure to demonstrate sufficient academic achievement may result in withdrawal.

Policies pertaining to classroom students:

- Attendance: All lab students are required to attend school daily. All absences are to be phoned

ELECTIVE COURSES ONLY AT GUO OR OLA

Art - Create original artworks in a variety of media and techniques. Learn art history, cultural awareness, and art appreciation. Need access to either Microsoft products or Google applications to submit work for this course. Art supplies needed: 9"x12" multi-media sketch pad, 2B and 6B pencils, blending stump, eraser, colored pencils, white air-dry clay, black sharpie fine point pen. If you need materials, check out from Online Learning Academy library.

<u>BioScience: Medical Terms Semester 1 and Semester 2:</u> The study of medical terminology, health professions and the legal and ethical considerations of medicine while learning about diagnoses, disease, treatment, and careers related to the nervous and musculoskeletal systems. No required texts.

BOSAS: Computer Applications - Business Operations and Software Semester 1: Enhance technical knowledge and skills associated with functions within business operations. Use different software packages to accomplish tasks related to business and industry. Areas of study include Microsoft Office Suite and Adobe Creative Cloud. Master the use of a spreadsheet, database, presentation software, advanced word processing, and personal finance software. If taken full time at home, there is a cost to download the required software.

<u>Psychology</u> surveys the major sub-disciplines of the field, including topics as the brain and neuroscience, behavior, cognitive and social development, learning, memory, decision-making, the teenage brain, consciousness, emotions, motivation, and psychological disorders. Intensive vocabulary and practical application of the psychological principles. No texts required.

<u>Child Development Semester 1</u> Early childhood education course focuses on the growth and development of young children, conception through preschool age. Students will develop knowledge and skills in working with young children that can be applied to future careers and parenting.

<u>Creative Writing</u> is an engaging elective course which explores various genres of writing including: fairytales, mystery, horror, sci-fi, fantasy/magical realism, and poetry. Students will interact with inspiring model texts, carefully curated videos, links to interesting websites and research, and engaging images to spark a creative imagination. In addition, students are coached throughout the writing process through unit lists (and quizzes on) literary devices and techniques — techniques writers may go on to use in their own writing. Students will anthologize all writing produced in this course in a final writing portfolio. No required texts.

<u>Forensics</u> will cover an introduction to the main principles and sub-disciplines of forensic science to include units on serology, toxicology, DNA evidence, fingerprinting, and trace evidence. The problem solving that is included in this course requires students to use analysis skills and apply knowledge from a broad range of formulas. No required books. Pre-requisite: 1 year of Biology completed.

Music Appreciation. This course is broken up into six units: Introduction to Music, general information about sound, reading music. Instrumentation, reviewing types of instruments. History of music including: Medieval Music and the Renaissance, Baroque and Classical Music, Romantic and 20th Century Music, and Modern Music.

<u>Personal Development</u> uses Sean Covey's book, The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens, students will apply strategies for improving themselves and their relationships with others, giving students the ability to overcome obstacles, set goals, make positive decisions, and employ the 7 Habits to enable them to navigate and succeed in their teen years and beyond. Students will be interacting with the text by learning about and applying the principles of the 7 Habits to real-life situations and those portrayed in videos. Students will show their mastery of the concepts through answering study questions, analyzing problems by writing about them, and completing a project. Book required for course.

Short Stories gives students a more in-depth focus on the English language arts literary elements. Focusing on various genres of short stories, the students will be reintroduced to analysis vocabulary, and how authors use those tools to tell their story. Students will be expected to read and analyze the short stories, as well as discuss how those elements enhance the reader's experience with the story. Students will also learn more about the background of the genres of these stories, and produce written and video analysis. No required books.

World War II is a history of the Second World War. The course starts with the end of World War I and the causes of World War II and continues through the occupations of Germany and Japan at the end of the war. The course focuses on major battles and the human cost of war. Some of the topics and images depicted are graphic in nature, as the course attempts to give an accurate portrayal of the events that occurred during the Second World War. No required books.

Spanish 1-4 students study the Spanish language to be able to read speak and listen. Meets foreign language requirements for University.
